1. Be respectful and courteous

4. Engage thoughtfully with peers

5. Be clear and concise

• Express your ideas clearly and succinctly. Avoid overly long posts that might overwhelm readers, but ensure you are thorough in explaining your points.

6. Acknowledge others' contributions

 Recognize and build on the ideas presented by your peers. A simple acknowledgment can foster a sense of community and encourage more interaction.

7. Follow 'netiquette' guidelines

 Use proper grammar, avoid slang or overly casual language, and refrain from using all caps (which can be interpreted as shouting). This ensures your communication is professional and easily understood.

8. Be open to different perspectives

9. Check in regularly

• Participate consistently and check the forum regularly to stay engaged with ongoing discussions. Timely responses contribute to a dynamic and active forum.
